

Agrilus planipennis subsp. *ulmi* (photos 1773-1, 1773-2, 1773-3). Body size: 11.5 mm-15.0 mm. V-shaped slit on center of face. Some individuals have gold or copper coloration. Habitat Beijing, China; Japanese population subspecies; habitat Sapporo, Japan. Very small differences [L. Bauer comment: possibly the author was referring to morphological comparisons made of specimens from Beijing and Sapporo]. Adults July and August in mountains in Sapporo. Hosts walnut, elm, ash, gathered from weakened trees. Known from Hokkaido to Kyushyu Prefectures, Japan; Korea; Northern China; and Mongolia.

We felt the information provided by this section on *A. planipennis* might be helpful for those studying this invasive buprestid in North America. This book is written in Japanese and this legend was translated by an anonymous colleague.]
