FOREST AREA IN WISCONSIN COUNTIES, 1968

ABSTRACT. — In 1968 Wisconsin's forests covered 14.9 million acres of land, a slight decline from the 15.2 million acres reported in 1956. The area of commercial forest land also dropped slightly to 14.5 million acres; increases in the eastern part of the State of 50,000 acres were more than offset by losses of 381,000 acres in the west and central sections.

The third forest survey of Wisconsin shows that 14.9 million acres or 43 percent of the land area was forested in 1968. Almost two thirds of the forested land occurs in the two northern survey units (fig. 1). In 1956, forest land totaled 15.2 million acres.

Timber-using industries now have 14.5 million acres of forest land in Wisconsin to consider in their search for raw materials. This is the acreage suitable for growing industrial timber products and is defined as commercial forest land (table 1). The northeast and northwest survey units (roughly the northern half of the State) support nearly two thirds of the State's commercial forest land. The most heavily forested county in this area as well as in the entire State is Bayfield County with 777,300 acres of commercial forest.

The two eastern survey units together registered a slight gain in commercial forest land of 50,000 acres but the western part of the State (central and west-

ern units) showed a decline of 381,000 acres. State-wide, then, commercial forest land declined 2.2 percent during the 12 years between surveys. In the following tabulation, 1956 areas have been adjusted for boundary changes between forest survey units and to align the 1956 estimates more closely with definitions of land classification used in the 1968 Survey.

Only 3 percent of Wisconsin's forests are classified as noncommercial. Of the 409,000 acres in this classification, 34,000 acres are productive, but reserved for other uses. Adverse site conditions on the remaining acres preclude the growth of timber products suitable for industrial use.

The sampling error of area for this survey was ± 0.4 percent for the 14.5 million acres of commercial forest land. The third forest survey of Wisconsin was conducted by the North Central Forest Experiment Station and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. Additional publications on timber volume, growth, and removals in Wisconsin are being prepared and will be available in the near future.


